The Medea Adaptive Pavilion Workshop

MEDEA, Mediterranean Ecological Adaptation strategies for urban and landscape regeneration, is a major research project by Sapienza University of Rome spanning from 2023 to 2026, focusing on adaptation strategies for Mediterranean habitats. MEDEA, in collaboration with universities, local authorities, stakeholders, and citizens, studies sustainable development scenarios in fragile Mediterranean areas concerning major climate and social changes.

The MEDEA SHADE Lab is a design laboratory aimed at developing, in collaboration with local administrations, a concrete project for cities and landscapes geared towards climate adaptation and ecological transition in open spaces within municipal territory. The transformation of a common area is envisioned with the construction of a Medea Adaptive Pavilion (MAP) of approximately 100 square meters, serving as an ecological device experimenting with nature-based solutions and developing environmental, informational, and digital networking performances in relation to prevalent climate change risks.

The MEDEA | CARLOFORTE | SHADE LAB Workshop will take place in Carloforte, San Pietro Island (CA-Italy), from September 16th to 21st, 2024. It is open to the participation of 25 students from Italian and foreign universities who will work on project development in mixed groups under the guidance of tutors from the promoting universities.

Participation in the workshop is free. There are no additional contributions for travel and accommodation expenses in Carloforte, which will be covered by participating students.

For those interested, an agreement has been activated with the Municipality of Carloforte, which includes a lodging cost of 20 euros per night per student.

The application for participation must include the student's details (name, surname, student ID, date of birth, place of birth, residence), field of study, telephone number, email address, and must be accompanied by a copy of a valid identity document.

The application must be accompanied by:

- a brief curriculum vitae (maximum 1 A4 sheet, specifying any participation in similar workshop activities and internships, proficiency level in computer programs for graphic representation, and proficiency level in English and Spanish languages);
- a project portfolio (maximum 3 A4 sheets, horizontal)

The application, curriculum vitae, and portfolio must be sent in PDF format by Monday, July 15th, 2024, to the following email address: medea.sapienza@uniroma1.it The subject of the email should be: "International Design Workshop "MEDEA | CARLOFORTE | SHADE LAB".
