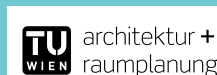

STUDY DAY

Among the changes induced by the Covid-19 Pandemic, the most evident and radical difference concerns the issues of cultural life and public space. In a very short time, both sectors were strongly reduced, in some cases almost cancelled, and the reactivation process was, and is, very slow and discontinuous. The fear of physical contact translates into new rules of urban behaviour, which result unsustainable in the long term.

In this context, the Study Day entitled **New Boundaries. Public space toward a sustainable urban environment** proposes an interdisciplinary and international reflection on the theme of sustainable and resilient public space with particular reference to the border spaces of urban waterfronts, as part of a comparison of research and design practices developed by the European universities involved in the framework of the New European Bauhaus initiative.

The theme of the boundary, of the margin, takes on a scientific and technical dimension but also a philosophical and artistic one, as an area of research and design experimentation connected to the topic of public space and the space of water.

The experimentation concerns urban interventions developed at different scales, from design to architecture and urban planning, with the aim of promoting sustainable lifestyles and behaviours resilient to environmental and social changes and to the risks associated with the Covid-19 pandemic. The reflection also includes experimentation of site-specific art forms attentive to the historical and naturalistic value of urban waterfronts, marginal areas between the city and the river, between the natural environment and urban space.

The reflection is aimed at defining references to improve the quality of the project of the public space in European waterfronts, putting in synergy interdisciplinary knowledge and promoting a contamination between the architectural and artistic practices, carried out in different countries. References must pursue the improvement of physical and social interaction in relation to emergency and long-term health and environmental risks.

The reflection is open to European Universities and Cultural Institutions that agree to give a contribution to this reflection in the disciplinary fields of design, architectural planning, urban planning, environmental and landscape planning, artistic disciplines and performing arts.
